What's Behind Conowingo Dam?

Is the Chesapeake Bay about to be flooded with millions of tons of sediment and phosphorus pollution? That is the threat posed by the Conowingo Dam. The dam is nearly full and losing its ability protect the Bay from a tidal wave of sediment and phosphorus pollution.

What can be done to prevent such a catastrophe?

The public is invited to learn about the Conowingo Dam and its threat to the Bay during the next meeting of the Severn River Association (SRA).

Our special guest, Dr. Beth McGee, Lead Scientist with the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, will address the risks posed by the dam during her presentation, *Conowingo - Are there any Good Options?*
