Stormwater Repairs: What's In Store for the Severn River in 2014?

Now that the battle over the stormwater tax in Maryland has been settled, at least for now, what will Anne Arundel County do to protect the Severn River?

The public is invited join with the Severn River Association (SRA) on December 17 to hear how the county plans to protect the Severn River in 2014 and beyond.

Our guest speaker will be Ginger Ellis, Environmental Plan Administrator for Watershed, Ecosystem & Restoration Services with the county's Department of Public Works.

Ms. Ellis will address the county's goals, plans, successes and challenges with regard to the Severn River.

For example, Ms. Ellis recently joined SRA's Michael Robinson on one of his ongoing Severn Headwater Hikes to get a first-hand look at the stormwater outfall problems caused by the Rt. 3 and Rt. 97 interchanges that cause so much destruction in the Severn River headwaters.
