Is Your Favorite Tree a Savior or a Destroyer?

Do you know just when your beloved backyard tree turns from friend to foe?

Master Arborist Tyler Balderson will explain how to care for trees, where to plant them, and critically, how to spot trouble when a good tree goes bad. Balderson will explain the best ways to plant and manage your trees Tuesday, July 17, during the next meeting of the Severn River Association (SRA).

As part of SRA's continuing Educational Series, our guest speaker, a board-certified Master Arborist with Bartlett Tree Experts, will also explain how the new Critical Areas rules affect future tree plantings and management. He'll also explain:

- Which trees to plant on steep slopes
- The Top 5 trees to plant and where
- Which trees go best near the water
- Best Practices for caring for trees
- What to do with invasive trees
- When and whether it makes any sense to top off trees
- When you should trim trees
- Whether they should overhang a house
- How to spot weak trees before they fall, and
- What to do to minimize possible damage from hurricane winds and rain.
