"Restoring water quality in the Chesapeake Bay watershed: what is working and what still needs to be done"

Over the past 30 years, there's been a constant push to align all the scientific, social and political tea leaves to achieve a cleanup of the Chesapeake Bay watershed.

But are any of these programs really working? Is the Bay demonstrably any cleaner and safer for fishing, swimming and recreation?

Attendees at the next Severn River Association (SRA) Educational Series meeting on September 16 will finally get an answer.

Scott Philips, Chesapeake Bay Coordinator, MD-DE-DC Water Science Center, with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) will explain the tough process of trying to measure results and offer some proof that the programs to Save The Bay are working ... or not.
